

Neighbourhood Planning Workshop

CPRE Bedfordshire is pleased to present a one-day workshop to bring together representatives from Parish and Town Councils in Bedfordshire to learn and share experiences of Neighbourhood Planning.

The event aims to provide information and to offer opportunities for discussion across a range of interest levels, from councils thinking about starting a Neighbourhood Plan, to those who are well advanced or already have an adopted plan. The programme is designed to provide time for delegates who are well advanced in their plan making to share their experience with those that are at an early stage, as well as opportunities for early and advanced planning groups to discuss and share experiences with others at a similar stage.

The workshop will include input from a keynote speaker, Dave Chetwyn, who is a leading expert on neighbourhood planning. Dave is already providing consultancy support to several planning groups in Bedfordshire. He will give an opening address that will highlight the benefits of neighbourhood planning and how to make an effective plan.

The discussion groups provide opportunities for delegates to focus on their specific needs, for example, to think about whether a neighbourhood plan would benefit their community, and for groups at an advanced stage, to exchange ideas about completing and implementing their plan.

Lunch will be provided and tea and coffee will be available throughout the day.



Dave Chetwyn is Managing Director of Urban Vision Enterprises CIC, an Associate to the Consultation Institute, and a Design Council CABE Built Environment Expert. He acts as planning adviser to Locality and as a consultant specialist on Crossrail Thames Tunnels Section. He has also acted as a neighbourhood plan independent examiner. Other roles include Chair of the Historic Towns Forum and Vice Chair (Third Sector)

of the National Planning Forum. Dave has advised various Government departments, groups, reviews and Parliamentary select committees on planning, regeneration, heritage, urban design, economic development, state aid and community empowerment. He was the author of the Locality Roadmap Guide to Neighbourhood Planning.
